

BLUE AND GRAY REUNION.

Large Crowd Assembled Near Calhoun, McLean County.

Owensboro, Ky., Sept. 25.—(Special.)—About fifteen hundred people attended the Blue and Gray reunion at Ballantyne's Grove, one and a half miles below Calhoun, to-day. An excursion boat brought a large crowd from Morgantown, Rockport, Livermore, South Carrollton and other points on Green river, and Butler, Muhlenberg, Ohio, Daviess, Henderson and other counties sent delegations.

Thirty-two sheep were barbecued and other provisions served in proportion. The exercises of the day were of a purely patriotic and fraternal character. Capt. Henry Ballantyne, of Calhoun, headed the Confederate veterans and George W. Adams, of Sacramento, headed the Union veterans. The Hon. Jep C. Johnson, of Greenville, spoke in the morning and Congressman Frank B. Posey, of Evansville, Ind., spoke in the afternoon. Both speeches were received with enthusiasm. The day passed without an unpleasant incident of any kind.
